

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE NAIL ACRYLIC

CREATING A FALSE NAIL:

- 1. Ensure the surface area of the false hand is dry and free from oil or grease. (You may require a primer to adhere acrylic to silicone).
- 2. Place the nail form on the finger as shown in diagrams 1 and 2. This form dictates the shape of the final nail.
- 3. Dispense small amounts of powder and liquid into separate dappen dished.
- 4. Take an artists sable brush medium sized, dip the tip into the liquid, then dip the tip only i

nto the powder, with a gentle motion rotate until a small pearl like shape forms on the tip to

the brush. (From this point you have approximately 3 mins working time at 20 Deg.C)

5. Gently transfer the material to a position just forward of where the half moon area on the nail

would be. With the side of the bursh, gently pat the material with a slight pulling motion thus

moving the material to the tip. Now puch the material forward towards the cuticle area, the material


should feather into the cuticle, as the thnner you can make it the better it will adhere and create a more pleasing shape. After creating the cuticle shape return to patting the material out towards the tip all the time reinforcing the lateral curvature. NOTE try to achieve as perfect a nail shape as possible, as this reduces the amount of filing needed to create the finished nail. Before the nail dries, finish off by brushing across the nail, as this greatly adds to its strength.

6. When the nail is completely dried (approximately 6 mins @ 20Deg. C) remove the nail form. You can now file and buff the nail to create a good shape and finish.
